"Forget," says the apostle Paul to the church in Philippi. You'll find it recorded in the Bible in book of Philippians, chapter 3, verse 13: "...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead..." And we might respond, "Finally, something we are good at!" Who can go one day without forgetting something? From little things like where we left our car keys, to not so little things like the date of our anniversary, even the best of us forgets. And it's not for the lack of trying. We cannot do both at the same time. **So**, it comes down to a matter of what we decide to think about. Will we rehash that which is done and cannot be changed, or will we focus instead on where and what we want to be when our days on this earth are done? <u>We can forget</u> those things that hold us back when we strive to attain God's purpose for our lives.
