

It's Not Ours, It's God's

There once was a man who owned a beautiful Harley Davidson motorcycle. It was a wine-colored machine with the hydroglide fork on the front wheel. As I understand it, that hydroglide fork was an engineering miracle in motorcycling in its day. Anyway, it was his teenage son's greatest thrill to ride that motorcycle.

One day he asked, "Dad, can I ride your motorcycle again this afternoon?" Dad's words have stuck with him ever since. "You can ride it anytime you want to, anywhere you want to, and as often as you want to... just as long as you remember to ride it like it was mine and not yours."

Reflecting on that statement, we need to see that, "God has given us full and free use of this world. All He asks is that we use it like it was His and not ours. That's stewardship."

Following God's purpose in material possessions certainly involves giving through His church.

"Freely we have received, freely we are to give."

Paul says that we are to give out of love and thanksgiving to the glory of God, that God loves a cheerful giver, and a cheerful giver loves God more than self.

Our giving and our lifestyle ought to reflect that Christ is our Lord. Our lifestyle should reflect that we can tell the difference between necessities and luxuries. As Christian stewards, our lifestyle and giving reflect the responsibility we feel for the blessings God has bestowed upon us. And our lifestyle will show that we seek contentment in doing God's will and fulfilling God's purpose for the world.

I recently found a paraphrase of a verse that is a favorite for many people... John 3:16. There are two ways to read it. Read them both and then decide which applies to you?

"Mr. & Mrs. Blank of First Presbyterian Church, so loved the world that they gave up what was dear to them so that the work of the Lord in the church might go forward. This they did so that others might know of eternal life and not perish."

Or "Mr. & Mrs. Blank of First Presbyterian Church so loved themselves so much that they withheld all but a trifling amount of their money so that they might gratify their own whims, caring little whether the Lord or their church could carry on. This they did in spite of the fact that they knew people would perish without the word of eternal life."

Jesus said, "Lay up not treasures on earth but treasures in heaven for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Let's remember that what we have is not ours - it's God's. Pastor Tom
