Greetings to our Church Family,

I wonder if you can remember the "Broom Hilda" cartoon in which her troll-like, naive, innocent little friend Irwin puts on a long-tailed formal tuxedo jacket, picks up a conductor's baton and walks into the woods alone.

Irwin steps up on a fallen tree trunk and begins to wave his arms as if to conduct. There are no musicians, only rocks, trees and flowers. Soon, musical notes pour from the rocks, trees and flowers and fill the panel. Finally, Irwin turns and confidently says to the reader, "It's all in there; you just have to work at getting it out."

As we look at this new year that has just arrived, we know it is filled with all kinds of dreams and possibilities: "They're all in there; we just have to work at getting them out."

I wonder how many dreams are never realized because the dreamer never gets into action. If you were to follow the stories of immigrant families who come to this country, you would find episode after episode of astounding success. Why? One reason has to be a sense of urgency--they simply cannot afford to fail. There is no safety net to catch them. They don't have the social networks that others can rely on--they have only themselves.

Jesus had a sense of urgency about his life. It is clear from the time that he came out of the river after being baptized by John that his face was set toward his mission in Jerusalem. That did not mean that he did not take time for reflection. In fact, he immediately went into the wilderness for forty days of testing, prayer and self-examination. But nothing could delay him, discourage him or defeat him.

HE DID NOT LOOK BACK. In fact, in Luke 9:62 Jesus says it pointedly: "No man, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."

Jesus knew there was no turning back. Tranquil days in the carpenter shop of Nazareth were soon only a dream. This is who he was and what he had been called to achieve. The threats of public humiliation, imprisonment and even death on the cross did not dissuade him. He had committed himself to God's plan for his life... and He would see it through.

Now as we begin the new year of 2024, it is a time for new beginnings. So let's start this New Year with a sense of humility and urgency and a commitment to give our very best to whatever noble dream God has placed in our heart.

When we do that, I believe that we can achieve great things for the Lord.
